Please park towards the back of the property away from customer parking.	Take I5 north to Chemawa Road (Exit 260); Go west and turn right just west of I-5 onto Radiant Drive. Go through Keizer Station and follow the signs to Volcano Stadium. Head north (Radiant drive becomes 35 th street) past stadium and turn right onto Quinaby Road. The nursery is on the north side of Quinaby Road and before you reach the bridge over I5. Be sure to park towards the back of the property away from customer parking.	Go south on Highway 99W towards Monroe. Watch for signs 8 miles south of Corvallis, Turn right onto Finley Road and proceed to Refuge Headquarters. There are a number of turn outs along the road that provide large vistas of the park and valley.

Directions	Take 99W north from Corvallis to Monmouth—at stop light turn right on Main Street, Go into Independence and turn left at the 'T' intersection. Park is on right after about a block or so—we will meet at the park.	Take the Alsea highway at the fork just past Philomath. Drive to the top of the pass (about 9 miles) turn right on Mary's Peak Road and drive to the top. A Northwest Forest Pass or Golden Eagle, Age or Access Pass is required to park. The critique will be at the parking lot area at the top	Take highway 99w south to Greenberry road—turn right and follow signs on right to Tyee Winery. Those coming from the Philomath area, take Bellfountain to Greenberry (just past Inavale School) and turn left onto Greenberry. The winery is just a half mile from the Bellfountain road intersection. Parking is in the large field south of the winery.	Take highway 34 Lebanon and then Highway 20 to Sweet Home—go thorough town to Foster lake. Just past the lake, turn left onto Quartzville Road. Cross two bridges—just after the 2nd bridge, turn left onto North River Road. Go about 1/2 mile and Lewis Creek County Park is on your left. Once in the park take the right fork to the parking lot down near the lake. (An alternate way is to go across Foster Dam and turn right onto N. River Road)

The Corvallis Farmer’s Market is held in the shade trees of the Benton County Fairgrounds. Fruit stands, colorful vegetables and lots of people provide splashes of color.	The grounds have a number of circa 1840 houses and a mill constructed in 1889. A stream and open areas complement the area. Entry to the grounds is free. Set up away from congested areas as this is a small site with lots of foot traffic. There is a restaurant on site	Large pond, wedding grounds, gazebo, views of the valley. Take 99W towards Monmouth, go about 10 miles to the blinking light on to Airlie Road and go about 6 miles. Turn left onto Maxfield Creek Road. Go about 2.5 to vineyard on the left. Park in the area near the picnic shelter and along the road before turning into the winery. Do not park up near the house and wine cellars.	The fairgrounds are just south of the intersection of Walnut, Harrison and 53rd west of Corvallis. They are on 53rd between Harrison and Philomath Blvd. They are about 2.5 miles from downtown.
